I've recorded and released **7 singles**, **24 albums**, and **2 EPs**. I've written **250 songs**, half of which are pretty good, one of which, **Classical Gas** is apparently really good. I've played at least **1,000 gigs** in a lot of different places. I've written well over **1,000 poems** plus a bunch of other stuff and created **bunches of art** too, published **16 literary/art books** and **5 music books**, written **174 hours of broadcast television** (and even more hours of unbroadcastable television), received **11 awards** and **8 nominations**.
